GRACE CHURCH WILLIAMSBURG MEMBERSHIP

Introduction:

At Grace Church Williamsburg (GCW), we want to honor God and truth in all we do. As pastors, we also desire to be faithful stewards and servants in our ministries. To that end, we have developed the following process to help us better manage your request for membership in our congregation. Deciding on a church home/family is a sobering reality. Our prayer is that this process will give you and our elders (pastors) the very best opportunity to make informed, godly decisions about this important step in your life.

Purpose:

In fulfilling our goal to honor the Lord, we seek to do God's business God's way. This application and the membership process are simply tools used by our elders to better ascertain your spiritual condition and readiness for church membership. There are several reasons why our elders need to assess this with you:

- 1) They are responsible for members' souls as they provide watch-care over God's people knowing that elders are answerable to God for their work (Heb. 13:17; Acts 20:28; 1 Pet. 5:1-5). It is a matter of integrity and faithfulness for our **elders**.
- 2) The Lord calls Christians to spiritual unity, like-mindedness, and peace with one another (Eph. 4; Col. 3:12-17; 1 Thess. 5:12-15). Church membership officially involves individuals in a corporately shared commitment of loving and serving one another. It is a matter of integrity and faithfulness for the **congregation**.
- 3) Your personal investment in the shared ministries of GCW will stand to impact you, your family, and the congregation. Prudence and care demand that our pastors guide prospective members in performing their due diligence before this "marriage" takes place. It is a matter of integrity and faithfulness for **you**.

Procedure:

First, read provided copy of Life in the Father's House.

<u>Second</u>, complete the application included in this packet. (Each prospective member will need to fill out an application)

Third, return the completed application(s) to one of the elders.

<u>Fourth</u>, the elders will review your application and schedule an appointment to talk with you about your testimony and to discuss any issues or questions they (or you) might have concerning doctrine, ministry, and membership responsibilities.

If going through a process like this is unfamiliar to you, please keep in mind that the pastors are praying for you, and that the interview is a friendly way for us to discuss, on the front end, what your membership involves. We won't quiz you or try to trip you up with hard questions. Relax. We are so excited about the Lord bringing you to Grace Church. We are looking forward to our time with you.

<u>Fifth</u>, when you are received by the elders, they will recommend on a Sunday morning that the <u>church</u> officially receive you for membership.

May the Lord guide us all through this process as we trust His will to be done for our good and for His glory.

HOW TO PREPARE A TESTIMONY

- 1. Remember the purpose of a personal testimony—to exalt Christ.
- 2. Keep your testimony to three minutes or less (one side of 8 ½ x 11, single spaced).
- 3. When sharing regarding your life before Christ you want to avoid these things:
 - a. Do not mention <u>specific details</u> about your sinful past behavior. You are not emphasizing the situations and actions of your sinful past, but God helping you see your need for His forgiveness for your sins against <u>Him</u>. Be general, and use statements like, "I lived for myself and pursued my own ideas of right/wrong."
 - b. Do not mention denominations, other churches or church organizations, or individuals by name. We are not highlighting others' shortcomings.
 - c. Do not slander a member of your family, mention by name friends you sinned with, or speak in a negative way about your spouse. Your testimony is not about others, but it is about how God has worked in your life to save you from sin.
- 4. When relating how you came to Christ, you will want to include these things:
 - a. Be <u>specific</u> about how you put your faith in Christ as Savior and what it means. You are testifying to God's forgiveness of your sins through His gift of His Son, Jesus Christ. When others leave, they should be able to trust Jesus as Savior based on your words and example.
 - b. God's Word does the work in the heart, so use the Bible and share Scripture relating to how you became a Christian. Remember, "... faith comes from hearing, and hearing by the word of Christ." (Rom. 10:17). God said, "So will My word be which goes forth from my mouth; It will not return to Me empty, without accomplishing what I desire, and without succeeding in the matter for which I sent it." (Is. 55:11). For example: John 3:36; Acts 4:12; Rom. 3:23 and 6:23, 10:9-10; 2 Cor. 5:21; Col. 2:13-14.
 - c. When relating the changes which took place <u>after</u> receiving Christ, attribute those changes to Jesus. For example, "Jesus changed my attitude toward...," "Jesus began to help me with my problems...," NOT "I...and then I...."
 - d. We encourage you to write out your testimony word for word (one side of 8 ½ x 11, single spaced). Edit and rewrite until it is an effective tool for sharing Christ. We will ask you to share this with us when we meet with you. Please feel free to read it to us.
